SENIOR PROJECT

Title: Dog is God

Medium: Photobook + Prints

Format: 9" × 12"

Description: The central quality of this collection of images stems from a two-part observation. First, the contemporary individual swims in the ambiguity of a brutal, hastily-assembled world. Second and in contrast, brief moments of light make existence beyond worthy, so all is not bleak. Still, genuine sentiment is often lost in translation, disease creates anxious energy, love is hard to feel, and most desire what will destroy them in the end. I believe that it is unproductive to focus on this darkness for there is a light hidden from the rational mind that lurks in the body and appears in moments of clarity. The images of this book attempt to bottle this light, as well as the shadows it produces. The images also catalog, what it is like to be a young man today. With an inconsistent disposition, the photographs interrogate, celebrate, and condemn the difficult and characteristic conventions of machismo, excess, vagrancy, and sexuality within the context of young men in California.



PREVIOUS WORK

Title: The Subsection of the Eagle

Medium: Conceptual/Political Publication

Format: 9" × 12"

Description: A visceral publication that reacts to border politics and inequality, aesthetically informed by military technology. On the smaller pages the type is put through a program to shuffle each sentence. The complete Secure Fence Act of 2006 is the input. None of the sentences are coherent. The shuffling is meant to instill a sence of confusion, anger, and inaccesibility to the sharp, inhuman language of legal prose. The large format pages are digital infrared photographs captured on a Canon 6D, with a Lee 87 red camera filter. Each exposure is 30 seconds, with a high aperature and ISO. The images mimick the cutting edge, incredibly expensive, and military-grade cameras the U.S. Border Patrol utilizes to do their job.


PREVIOUS WORK
